

Winter Craft Workshop



What crafts will be included in the Winter Craft Workshop? We will make paper roll fir trees, spice wreaths, painted clay ornaments, folded book page book marks, a snowball ornament with a face that's catching a snowflake on its tongue, candy container Santa Clauses, mice in hanging cradles, poinsettia leaf gift toppers, button ornaments, cotton ball mushrooms, pipe cleaner dolls, candy cane watercolor paintings, Christmas scenes on jar lids, pipe cleaner candy canes, Christmas card baskets, clothes pin candles, fir trees painted on book pages, pressed paper gift tags, folded paper houses, jingle bell acorns, paper doll holiday lanterns, paper roll lanterns, garlands, icicles.

Will they be appropriate for all ages? They will! Very small children can color on the paper crafts with markers and crayons and colored pencils, older children can paint them, and go through the process of learning to make some of them themselves, teens and adults will be able to make some of the more complicated projects. There will be levels of dexterity needed for each project. If your fingers are slightly less nimble than they could be, there will be an easier form of the craft.

<u>Will you like them?</u> Well I like them, and I can only go by my own tastes, and the reviews I've had in the past of crafts I've produced for people to enjoy. I think you will.

How does the craft time work? I will set up a crafting area with the materials, let you get started, and you can make the craft. You have to stay at the crafting area, no carrying paint or glue or clay or glitter anywhere in the library.
